

QUILT DESIGNED AND MADE BY Marissa Lare MACHINE QUILTED BY Cheryl Duncan

This cool and easy-to-make quilt is perfect for a guy. It would be fantastic for a college-bound son or friend.

Finished Size: 57" x 76" Finished Blocks: 12 (19") blocks

MATERIALS

24 (10") squares assorted medium prints in gray, tan, and green
24 (10") squares assorted dark prints in gray, purple, and navy
1% yards white stripe
% yard purple print for binding
3% yards backing fabric
Twin-size quilt batting

NOTE: Fabrics in the quilt shown are from the Empire collection by David Butler for FreeSpirit.

<u>CUTTING</u>

Measurements include ¼" seam allowances.

From white stripe, cut:

• 12 (5") strips. From strips, cut 96 (5") squares.

From purple print, cut:

• $8(2\frac{1}{4}")$ strips for binding.

BLOCK ASSEMBLY

NOTE: For pressing tips, watch the video at FonsandPorter.com/ NYStateofMind.

 Referring to *Block Unit Diagrams*, draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of each white stripe 5" square. Draw a second line ¹/₂" away from the first as shown.




SEW SMART[™]


Be sure to position the white stripe squares with the stripes going horizontally, and mark from lower left to upper right as shown.

Place 2 white stripe squares atop

 medium print 10" square, right
 sides facing; stitch on all lines as
 shown. Cut between stitching
 lines to make 1 Block Unit and
 2 bonus triangle-squares. Press
 open to reveal triangles on Block
 Unit. Press triangle-squares open.
 Make 24 medium Block Units and
 48 triangle-squares. Set triangle squares aside for pillow tops or
 another project.

- **3.** In the same manner, make 24 dark Block Units and 48 trianglesquares using dark print 10" squares and white stripe 5" squares. Set triangle-squares aside for another project.
- Lay out 2 medium Block Units and 2 dark Block Units as shown in *Block Diagrams*. Join into rows; join rows to complete 1 block. Make 12 blocks.











QUILT ASSEMBLY

- **1.** Lay out blocks as shown in *Quilt Top Assembly Diagram* on page 4.
- **2.** Join blocks into rows; join rows to complete quilt top.


FINISHING

- Divide backing into 2 (1⁷/₈-yard) lengths. Join panels lengthwise. Seam will run horizontally.
- **2.** Layer backing, batting, and quilt top; baste. Quilt as desired.
- Join 2¼"-wide purple print strips into 1 continuous piece for straight-grain French-fold binding. Add binding to quilt.

I stitched in the ditch around each block and used the Freehand Mark Function to echo lines ¼" inside each block. Then I stitched a petalshaped design in dark areas, which creates a circle effect in the blocks.

RAIL FENCE

QUILT DESIGNED AND MADE BY Liz and Elizabeth Evans

The first quilt ever made by many veteran quilters is a baby quilt. A unique gift created with love for a baby is small, easy to manage, and a joy to create.

Finished Size: 39" × 42" **Finished Blocks:** 7 (6") blocks

MATERIALS

8 (2½"-wide) strips assorted prints in green, turquoise, and orange
½ yard orange print for blocks and binding
1¼ yards white solid
2¾ yards backing fabric
Crib-size quilt batting
*fat quarter = 18" × 20"

CUTTING

Measurements include ¼" seam allowances. From each of 2 (2½-wide) strips, cut:

• 3 $(2\frac{1}{2}" \times 6\frac{1}{2}")$ A rectangles.

From each of 6 (2¹/₂-wide) strips, cut:

• 2 $(2\frac{1}{2}" \times 6\frac{1}{2}")$ A rectangles.

From orange print, cut:

- 1 (2½"-wide) strip. From strip, cut 3 (2½" × 6½") A rectangles.
- 5 (2¹/₄"-wide) strips for binding. **From white solid**, **cut:**
- 1 (10¹/₂"-wide) **lengthwise** strip. From strip, cut 1 (10¹/₂" × 42¹/₂") B rectangle.
- 1 (23¹/₂"-wide) **lengthwise** strip. From strip, cut 1 (23¹/₂" × 42¹/₂") C rectangle.

BLOCK ASSEMBLY


- 1. Lay out 3 A rectangles as shown in *Block Diagrams*. Join to complete 1 block.
- 2. Make 7 blocks.

QUILT ASSEMBLY


- **1.** Referring to *Quilt Top Assembly Diagram*, lay out blocks as shown. Join blocks to complete pieced row.
- 2. Lay out pieced row and white B and C rectangles as shown. Join to complete quilt top.

FINISHING

- Divide backing into 2 (1³/₈-yard) lengths. Cut 1 piece in half lengthwise to make 2 narrow panels. Join 1 narrow panel to wider panel. Remaining narrow panel is extra.
- 2. Layer backing, batting, and quilt top; baste. Quilt as desired. Quilt shown was quilted with an overall loop design *(Quilting Diagram)*.
- **3.** Join 2¼"-wide orange print strips into 1 continuous piece for straight-grain French-fold binding. Add binding to quilt.

Dee designed and made a cheerful quilt to honor all breast cancer survivors. What's better than flowers—pink flowers!!

Finished Size: 73" × 91¼" **Finished Blocks:** 80 (9¹/₈") blocks

MATERIALS

40 (10") squares assorted pink prints 40 (10") squares assorted white prints 3⁄4 yard green print for binding 5½ yards backing fabric Queen-size quilt batting

<u>CUTTING</u>

Measurements include ¼" seam allowances. From green print, cut:

• 9 (2¹/₂"-wide) strips for binding.


BLOCK ASSEMBLY


- Referring to *Block Diagrams*, draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of 1 white print 10" square.
- 2. Place white print square atop 1 pink print square, right sides facing. Stitch ¼" away from drawn line on both sides.
- **3.** Cut on drawn line. Press open to reveal 2 blocks. Repeat to make 80 blocks.




SEW SMART[™]

Always press towards the dark fabric so the seam allowance won't show through the white fabric!





QUILT ASSEMBLY

- 1. Lay out blocks as shown in Quilt Top Assembly Diagram.
- 2. Join blocks into rows; join rows to complete quilt top.

FINISHING

- Divide backing into 2 (2³/₄-yard) lengths. Cut 1 piece in half lengthwise to make 2 narrow panels. Join 1 narrow panel to each side of wider panel; press seam allowances toward narrow panels.
- **2.** Layer backing, batting, and quilt top; baste. Quilt as desired. Quilt shown was quilted with an allover design.
- **3.** Join 2¼"-wide red print strips into 1 continuous piece for straight-grain French-fold binding. Add binding to quilt.



COLOR STUDY

QUILT DESIGNED AND MADE BY Kristine Peterson MACHINE QUILTED BY Kelly Van Vliet.

Inspired by a quilt designed by Janine Burke of Blue Underground Studio, Kristine used solid-color cottons for her striking creation.

Finished Size: 64" ×80" Finished Blocks: 80 (8") blocks

MATERIALS

32 fat quarters* solid fabrics in red, orange, pink, purple, green, and blue
5⁄8 yard multicolor stripe for binding
5¼ yards backing fabric
Twin-size quilt batting
*fat quarter = 18" × 20"



<u>CUTTING</u>

Measurements include 1/4" seam allowances.

From each fat quarter, cut:

6 (2½"-wide) strips. From strips, cut
 4 (2½" × 6½") B rectangles and 12
 (2½" × 4½") A rectangles.


From multicolor stripe, cut:

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• 8 (2¹/₄"-wide) strips for binding.


BLOCK ASSEMBLY

- Select 2 sets of 3 matching color A rectangles and 1 B rectangle.
- 2. Lay out 2 matching color A rectangles and 1 B rectangle, and 1 different color A rectangle as shown in *Block Unit Diagrams.* Join to complete 1 Block Unit.



Block Unit Diagrams

- **3.** In the same manner, make second Block Unit using remaining rectangles.
- **4.** Join pair of Block Units as shown to complete 1 block (*Block Diagram*). Make 59 blocks.



Block Diagram


 Make 8 single Block Units using 3 matching color rectangles and 1 different color rectangle in each.

QUILT ASSEMBLY

- **1.** Lay out blocks as shown in *Quilt Top Assembly Diagram.*
- **2.** Join into vertical rows, join rows to complete quilt top.

FINISHING


- Divide backing into 2 (2⁵/₈-yard) lengths. Cut 1 piece in half lengthwise to make 2 narrow panels. Join 1 narrow panel to each side of wider panel; press seam allowances toward narrow panels.
- 2. Layer backing, batting, and quilt top; baste. Quilt as desired. Quilt shown was quilted with a diagonal grid *(Quilting Diagram)*.
- **3.** Join 2¼"-wide stripe strips into 1 continuous piece for straight-grain Frenchfold binding. Add binding to quilt.





CRIB-SIZE CUTTING

From each fat quarter, cut:

 6 (2½"-wide) strips. From strips, cut 4 (2½" × 6½") B rectangles and 12 (2½" × 4½") A rectangles.

From multicolor stripe, cut:

• 5 (2¹/₄"-wide) strips for binding.

TWIN-SIZE CUTTING

From each fat quarter, cut:

 6 (2½"-wide) strips. From strips, cut 4 (2½" × 6½") B rectangles and 12 (2½" × 4½") A rectangles.

From multicolor stripe, cut:

• 9 (2¹/₄"-wide) strips for binding.

QUEEN-SIZE CUTTING

From each fat quarter, cut:

 6 (2½"-wide) strips. From strips, cut 4 (2½" × 6½") B rectangles and 12 (2½" × 4½") A rectangles.

From multicolor stripe, cut:

• 11 (2¹/₄"-wide) strips for binding.
