

Designer Corey Yoder's creations often feature a modern take on a traditional design. Here the classic log cabin block becomes a contemporary chevron design.

Finished Size: 72" × 89"

Finished Blocks: 32 (12") blocks

#### **MATERIALS**

½ yard each of 8 assorted solids in red, dark and light teal, pink, yellow, dark and light beige, and green

41/2 yards white solid 5¾ yards backing fabric Full-size quilt batting

**NOTE:** Fabrics in the quilt shown are from the Cotton Supreme Solids collection by RJR Fabrics.

#### KIT AVAILABLE

To order a kit for this project, go to the shop at ShopFonsandPorter.com.

Measurements include ¼" seam allowances. Border strips are exact length needed. You may want to make them longer to allow for piecing variations.

#### From each of 4 colored solids, cut:

- 5 (2½"-wide) strips. From strips, cut 3 (2½" × 12½") F rectangles,
  - 4 ( $2\frac{1}{2}$ " ×  $10\frac{1}{2}$ ") E rectangles,
  - 4 ( $2\frac{1}{2}$ " ×  $8\frac{1}{2}$ ") D rectangles,
  - 4 ( $2\frac{1}{2}$ " ×  $6\frac{1}{2}$ ") C rectangles,
  - 4 ( $2\frac{1}{2}$ " ×  $4\frac{1}{2}$ ") B rectangles, and
  - 4 (2½") A squares.

#### From each of 4 colored solids, cut:

- 5 (2½"-wide) strips. From strips, cut
  - 2 (2½" × 12½") F rectangles,
  - 4 (2½"  $\times$  10½") E rectangles,
  - 4 (2½" × 8½") D rectangles,
  - 4 (2½" × 6½") C rectangles,
  - 4 (2½" × 4½") B rectangles, and
  - 4 (2½") A squares.

## From remainders of solid pieces, cut a total of:

• 9 (2½"-wide) strips for binding.


#### From white solid, cut:


- 2 (18¼"-wide) strips. From strips, cut 4 (18¼") squares. Cut squares in half diagonally in both directions to make 16 side setting triangles (2 are extra).
- 1 (93%"-wide) strip. From strip, cut 2 (93%") squares. Cut squares in half diagonally to make 4 corner setting triangles.

44 (2½"-wide) strips. From 35 strips, cut 12 (2½" × 12½") F rectangles, 32 (2½" × 10½") E rectangles, 32 (2½" × 8½") D rectangles, 32 (2½" × 6½") C rectangles, 32 (2½" × 4½") B rectangles, and 32 (2½") A squares. Piece remaining strips to make 2 (2½" × 85½") side borders and 2 (2½" × 72½") top and bottom borders.

#### **BLOCK 1 ASSEMBLY**

- 1. Choose 1 matching color set of 1 A square, 1 B rectangle, 1 C rectangle, 1 D rectangle, 1 E rectangle, and 1 F rectangle. Lay out color pieces and 1 set of white pieces as shown in *Block 1 Diagrams*. Join in alphabetical order to complete 1 Block 1.
- **2.** Make 20 Block 1.








#### **BLOCK 2 ASSEMBLY**

- Choose 1 matching color set of

   A square, 1 B rectangle,
   C rectangle, 1 D rectangle, and
   E rectangle. Lay out color pieces and 1 set of white pieces as shown in *Block 2 Diagrams*. Join in alphabetical order to complete 1 Block 2.
- 2. Make 12 Block 2.






#### **QUILT ASSEMBLY**

- 1. Lay out blocks and white setting triangles as shown in *Quilt Top Assembly Diagram*. Join into diagonal rows; join rows to complete quilt center.
- **2.** Add white side borders to quilt center. Add white top and bottom borders to quilt.


- 1. Divide backing into
  2 (2¾-yard) lengths. Cut
  1 panel in half lengthwise
  to make 2 narrow panels. Join
  1 narrow panel to each side
  of wider panel; press seam
  allowances toward
  narrow panels.
- 2. Layer backing, batting, and quilt top; baste. Quilt as desired. Quilt shown was quilted with circles in the white portions of the blocks, long wavy lines in the colored portions of the blocks, and radiating lines in the setting triangles (Quilting Diagram).
- **3.** Join 2¼"-wide color strips into 1 continuous piece for straight-grain French-fold binding. Add binding to quilt.

A stunning example of the power of the super-scrappy quilt, this is a Log Cabin with curves. Over 60 different yellows and oranges are reined in by sophisticated slate gray.

Finished Size:  $72" \times 90"$ 

Finished Blocks: 80 (9") blocks



34 fat quarters\* assorted orange and yellow prints for blocks
4¼ yards dark solid for blocks and binding
5½ yards backing fabric
Full-size quilt batting

\*fat quarter = 18" × 20"

**NOTE:** Yellow and orange fabrics in the quilt shown are from Mary's mega stash collection. Gray is Kona cotton

Measurements include 1/4" seam allowances.

#### From fat quarters, cut a total of:

- 80 (2"  $\times$  8\%4") M rectangles.
  - 80 (2"  $\times$  7½") L rectangles.
  - 80 (2"  $\times$  6½") I rectangles.
  - 80 (2"  $\times$  5") H rectangles.
  - 80 (2"  $\times$  4½") E rectangles.
  - 80 (2"  $\times$  2 $\frac{3}{4}$ ") D rectangles.
  - 80 (2") A squares.


#### From dark solid, cut:


- 10 (2¼"-wide) strips for binding. 97 (1¼"-wide) strips.
  - From strips, cut:
- 80 (1\\'\' \times 9\\'\2\'') O rectangles.
  - 80 (1\\'\' \times 8\'\'\') N rectangles.
  - 80 (1¼"  $\times$  7¼") K rectangles.
  - 80 (1¼" × 6½") J rectangles.
  - 80 (1¼"  $\times$  5") G rectangles.
  - 80 (1½"  $\times$  4½") F rectangles.
  - 80 (1\\'\' \times 2\'\'\') C rectangles.
  - 80 (1¼"  $\times$  2") B rectangles.

**NOTE:** Label rectangles as you cut them for easy identification as you assemble. blocks. Sticky notes work well.

### **BLOCK ASSEMBLY**

- **1.** Stitch solid B rectangle to right side of print square as shown in *Block Assembly Diagrams*. Add solid C rectangle to top of A/B Unit.
- 2. Add remaining rectangles to A/B/C Unit in alphabetical order, working counter-clockwise to complete 1 block (*Block Diagram*). You'll be turning the block again and again to add your "logs."
- 3. Make 80 blocks.






#### **QUILT ASSEMBLY**

- **1.** Lay out blocks as shown in *Quilt Top Assembly Diagram*.
- **2.** Join blocks into rows; join rows to complete quilt top.



**Quilting Diagram** 

- **1.** Divide backing into 2 (2¾-yard) lengths. Cut 1 piece in half lengthwise to make 2 narrow panels. Join 1 narrow panel to each side of wider panel; press seam allowances toward narrow panels.
- 2. Layer backing, batting, and quilt top; baste. Quilt as desired. Quilt shown was quilted with continuous straight lines in print rectangles and crosshatching in solid rectangles—Mary feels this highlighted the geometric "feel" of the quilt. (Quilting Diagram).
- **3.** Join 2¼"-wide dark solid strips into 1 continuous piece for straight-grain French-fold binding. Add binding to quilt.

In trying to find a new way to lay out her log cabin blocks, designer Jane Vaughan hit upon this winning arrangement. You can duplicate her creation with 80 identical blocks joined in a variety of directions

Finished Size:  $60" \times 75"$ 

Finished Blocks: 80 (71/2") blocks

#### **MATERIALS**

16 fat quarters\* assorted dark prints 16 fat quarters\* assorted light prints

NOTE: For more variety, use more fabrics.

5/8 yard red print for binding 4¾ yards backing fabric Twin-size quilt batting \*fat quarter =  $18" \times 20"$ 

Measurements include ¼" seam allowances.

## From dark print fat quarters, cut a total of:

- 80 (2" × 8") E rectangles.
  - 80 (2"  $\times$  6½") D rectangles.
  - 80 (2"  $\times$  5") C rectangles.
  - 80 (2"  $\times$  3½") B rectangles.
  - 80 (2") A squares.

## From light print fat quarters, cut a total of:

- 80 (2"  $\times$  6½") D rectangles.
  - 80 (2"  $\times$  5") C rectangles.
  - 80 (2"  $\times$  3½") B rectangles.
  - 80 (2") A squares.

#### From red print, cut:

• 8 (2½"-wide) strips for binding.

#### **BLOCK ASSEMBLY**

- **1.** Lay out 1 set of block pieces as shown in *Block Diagrams*.
- **2.** Join block pieces in alphabetical order to complete 1 block. Make 80 blocks.

**NOTE:** As you join pieces together, press the seam allowances toward the most recently added piece except for the E rectangle. Press those seam allowances toward the center of the block.


























#### **QUILT ASSEMBLY**

- **1.** Lay out blocks as shown in *Quilt Top* Assembly Diagram.
- **2.** Join blocks into rows; join rows to complete quilt top.

- 1. Divide backing into 2 (23/8-yard) lengths. Cut 1 piece in half lengthwise to make 2 narrow panels. Join 1 narrow panel to each side of wider panel; press seam allowances toward narrow panels.
- **2.** Layer backing, batting, and quilt top; baste. Quilt as desired. Quilt shown was quilted with an allover swirl design (*Quilting Diagram*).
- **3.** Join 2¼"-wide red print strips into 1 continuous piece for straight-grain French-fold binding. Add binding to quilt.

The log cabin block is a favorite with quilters. If you have 10" squares in your stash, not strips, here's the solution.

Finished Size: 64" ×80"

Finished Blocks: 80 (8") blocks

#### **MATERIALS**

40 (10") squares assorted light prints40 (10") squares assorted dark prints1 yard red print for block centers and binding5 yards backing fabric

Twin-size quilt batting

Measurements include 1/4" seam allowances.


#### From each 10" square, cut:

**NOTE:** Refer to *Cutting Diagram*. Cut 10"squares carefully. There is very little waste.

• 5 (2"-wide) strips. From strips, cut
1 (2" × 8½") E rectangle, 2 (2" × 7")
D rectangles, 2 (2" × 5½") C rectangles,
2 (2" × 4") B rectangles, and
1 (2" × 2½") A rectangle.


#### From red print, cut:

5 (2½"-wide) strips. From strips, cut
80 (2½") squares for block centers.
8 (2½"-wide) strips for binding.



#### **BLOCK 1 ASSEMBLY**


- **1.** Lay out 1 red print center square; 1 set of light rectangles: A, B, C, and D; and 1 set of dark rectangles: B, C, D, and E as shown in *Block 1 Diagrams*.
- **2.** Join rectangles to center square in alphabetical order to complete 1 Block 1. Make 40 Block 1.

#### **BLOCK 2 ASSEMBLY**

- **1.** Lay out 1 red print center square; 1 set of dark rectangles: A, B, C, and D; and 1 set of light rectangles: B, C, D, and E as shown in *Block 2 Diagrams*.
- **2.** Join rectangles to center square in alphabetical order to complete 1 Block 2. Make 40 Block 2.





#### **QUILT ASSEMBLY**

- **1.** Lay out blocks as shown in *Quilt Top Assembly Diagram*.
- **2.** Join blocks into rows; join rows to complete quilt top.

- 1. Divide backing into 2 (2½-yard) lengths. Cut 1 piece in half lengthwise to make 2 narrow panels. Join 1 narrow panel to each side of wider panel; press seam allowances toward narrow panels.
- **2.** Layer backing, batting, and quilt top; baste. Quilt as desired.
- **3.** Join 2¼"-wide red print strips into 1 continuous piece for straight-grain French-fold binding. Add binding to quilt.
